Topics include elections, political participation, parties, interest groups, the Presidency, Congress, the bureaucracy, and the judiciary.</p> <p>(Fulfills GE III course)</p>	<p>Sociology 1 Introduction to Sociology (4 units) MANDATORY COURSE</p> <p>Soc 1 examines major sociological concepts, theories, and research findings illuminating processes of interpersonal interactions, social difference, and stratification, integration, and conflict.</p> <p>(Fulfills one GE III and IV course)</p>	<p>Math 1B Precalculus II (4 units) MANDATORY COURSE</p> <p>This course serves as preparation for calculus and other mathematics courses. Exponentials, logarithms, trigonometry, polynomials, and rational functions. Satisfies no requirements other than contribution to the 180 units required for graduation.</p> <p>Prerequisite: MATH 1A. Placement into MATH 1B via the Calculus Placement exam or a score of 450 or higher on the Mathematics section of the SAT Reasoning Test. Restriction: MATH 1B may not be taken for credit if taken after MATH 2A.</p>
